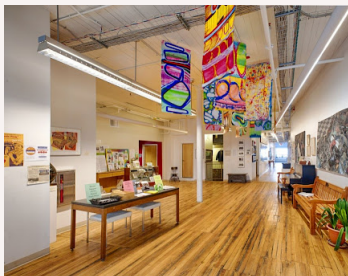

Community Training

We support partners in creating accessible spaces that accommodate and support the physical, sensory, communication, and social/emotional needs of people with disabilities. We offer site assessments, written recommendations, and venue-specific training that increases understanding of disabilities. As leading experts in the field, we provide high quality training and create customized supports for businesses and community organizations.

SNIP

Over the last 12 months the Special Needs Information Program (SNIP) expanded to 24 towns in our region. This voluntary safety program helps emergency responders identify and respond to residents with special needs. The benefits of the program to our most vulnerable citizens and to law enforcement make it an invaluable safety tool for our community.
